During the rest of the year our various churches use the camp for retreats or as a conference ground. The camp website (https://meu.com.uy/Camp Emanuel/) describes the mission of Camp Emmanuel. "Using the unique benefits of a Christian camp, we serve people by presenting God's Truth with God's love so that lives can change for the glory of God. We are a Christian organization at the service of the Local Church, using all activities outside the scope of the church to evangelize and edify, doing everything for the glory of God. We have a program that includes groups of people centered in Christ, living in a controlled environment, involved in both biblical preaching and biblical counseling, where the camper is guided to develop recreational, educational, social, and mental skills, knowing Christ as Savior, Lord and Friend."

Listed to the right are the projects to be accomplished at Camp Emmanuel for the Fall Work Trip. Because of travel restrictions, Rick Jensen will not be taking a team to Uruguay this year. However, there is still a list of projects that need to be accomplished. Henry Castro will be working with Pedro Donzé, the camp director, to accomplish these projects, along with volunteers from several of our Uruguay churches.

- Replace the kitchen ceiling and exhaust fans (required by the government) \$2,041
- New sidewalks around the perimeters of the cabins \$8,209
- Repair the girls' cabin floors \$3,840
- Gutters for the chapel \$1,220
- Security Cameras \$6,760
- Fencing around the water tanks \$910
- Fencing for the front of the camp \$2,956
- Maintenance of the children's play area \$975

Total: \$26,911

In addition to the above projects, we also have a list of projects that do not require our time, only money.

- Repair of the dining room fireplace \$2,266
- Remodeling the back porch, barbecue area \$12,054
- Tables and benches for the campsite (ten total) \$2,680

These projects are greatly needed, and we can't accomplish them without your help. Would you take a moment right now and ask God to help us meet these needs and at the same time ask Him if He would have you to contribute to this worthy cause?
