



Thank you again for your faithful support even during these difficult financial times. My heart is thrilled each month to witness God at work, faithfully supplying not only my personal needs but the needs of each of us as we partner together in ministry.

The year was 1853, the month was September when a small clipper set sail from Liverpool Harbor carrying a committed 21-yearold missionary named J. Hudson Taylor. He was on his way to serve in the country of China, where only a few dozen missionaries were stationed. Fifty-two years later, he would die, but what a legacy he left. During his lifetime, the missions agency that he founded, the China Inland Mission established 20 mission stations, launched 849 missionaries to the field, trained around 700 Chinese national workers, raised over four million dollars by faith, and saw the Chinese church grow to over 125,000. He had an amazing gift for inspiring individuals to give not only their possessions to Christ but also their lives. One of his most famous quotes was, "Depend upon it, God's work done in God's way will never lack God's supplies."

It is impossible to read or listen to current news reports without hearing some reference to declining economic indicators such as inflation, shortages of workers, and even a global supply chain crisis. As I write this letter, 169 cargo ships are anchored off the coast of Los Angeles waiting to be unloaded and the White House is warning us that with Christmas approaching, "There will be things that people can't get." I am saddened to see so many Christians who are ready to push the panic button. Sure, I hate having to pay on average \$1.22 more per gallon of gas as I did this time last year. My wallet also feels the pressure of rising prices for basic living expenses such as groceries, utilities, and medical services. Yet, I am reminded of the quote by William Carey, "The future is as bright as the promises of God." Paul makes a great promise to his dear friends in Philippians 4:19 But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus. This isn't a blanket promise that God is going to meet everyone's needs, but that God was going to meet the Philippian believers' needs. Because they were careful to take care of God's missionary, God was going to take care of them. For the sake of space, I will not list out all the promises of God in Philippians, but some of us need to reread the book and be encouraged.
