



Betrayed by a trusted friend, the verdict was declared in August of 1536. William Tyndale was stripped of his ordination as a priest then taken prisoner to the castle of Vilford. Two months later on October 6, he was strangled and then burned at the stake. He was only 42 years old. Never married. Never buried. His last words were a prayer, "Lord, open the King of England's eyes." Tyndale, often called "The Father of the English Bible," was a gifted linguist, fluent in eight languages including Hebrew and Greek. His burden was seen in conversations that he had around the table with biblically illiterate priests. "If God spares my life, ere many years pass, I will cause a boy that driveth the plow shall know more of the Scriptures than thou dost."

The Bible translator must constantly ask, "How do I put this into the common language?" Obviously, there are many literary hurdles. When we read our Bibles, much of the translator's art can be traced directly back to William Tyndale. 90% of our King James Version Bible comes directly from Tyndale's translation. He gave us such phrases as: Let there be light. (Genesis 1:3), Am I my brother's keeper? (Genesis 4:9), The Lord bless thee, and keep

thee. The Lord make his face shine upon thee, and be merciful unto thee. The Lord lift up his countenance upon thee and give thee peace. (Numbers 6:24–26), In the beginning was the word and the word was with God and the word was God. (John 1:1), There were shepherds abiding in the field. (Luke 2:8), Blessed are they that mourn for they shall be comforted. (Matthew 5:3), Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. (Matthew 6:9), etc.

His prayer, "Lord, open the King of England's eyes," was partially answered just three years after his death when Henry VIII required every parish church in England to make a copy of the English Bible available to its parishioners. "The Word of God is not bound!"

Thanks to gifts like yours, EMU International missionaries around the world for 76 years have faithfully taught and declared the truths of God's Word. We have taken the Scriptures across hostile borders physically, and virtually. Today, we have a team of EMU missionaries who are working with others to translate the Bible into the tribal languages of Northeastern Cambodia. "How do we put this into the common language?" Please pray with us that God will grant clarity and wisdom to this team of translators.

I scheduled several luncheons with ministry leaders in the Greenville area. We made a quick trip to Raleigh, NC, and visited Friendship Baptist Church. They support a couple of our EMU missionary families. Our son-in-law Kris Wilder serves as the youth pastor. I had a profitable trip to Florida and spoke at Victory Baptist Church in Zephyrhills. This was a last-minute change as my original meeting was canceled and rescheduled for August. Special thanks to Pastor David Toulson for allowing me to introduce EMU International to his church family. I participated in the ARCH National Pastors Fellowship at Community Baptist Church in Bradenton, a church that has supported EMU in the past. This annual meeting has

become a great opportunity to connect with like-minded ministries.

Last year I met Pastor Rick Ballard at the conference. His church

supports one of our EMU missionary families. I preached for them

in November. He and I shared a room at the conference. I also participated in a Missions Summit with about twenty missionary leaders. When I arrived home, Joanna and I took advantage of a gift certificate that we had received for Christmas and enjoyed an amazing night out at the Blueridge Restaurant at the Grove Park Inn. The buffet was amazing! We sat by the window as sunset and enjoyed a rare date night. I then will be with **Pastor Kevin Schall** at **Northwest Valley Baptist Church** in Glendale for the **FBFI Board meeting**. I return to Greenville on February 9. I have a few other lunch meetings planned when I return.

On February 18, I fly from Greenville to Miami where I will have a fourteen-and-a-half-hour layover. I then will fly through the night to **Uruguay**. I will preach in a couple of churches in **Montevideo** on Sunday, February 20. Our **Workers' Conference** begins on Tuesday, February 22, and ends on Friday, February 25. **Tim Chapman** will lead the training sessions. I will personally interview our national missionaries. I will preach in **Montevideo** on Sunday morning, February 27, and then drive about three hours north to **Durazno** for a service that evening. **Family Camp** begins the next day, Monday, February 28, and runs through Saturday morning, March 5. **Tim Chapman** will also be speaking at our **Family Camp**. I will travel seven hours north to **Rivera** to spend Sunday and preach at **Calvary Temple**. I will drive back to **Montevideo** on Monday and fly out that evening.
